AUTUMN CRAFT ACTIVITY: How to Preserve Leaves



What You Need:

- Glycerin
- Water
- · Flat pan or disposable plates
- A weight to keep leaves submerged
- Leaves

Method:

- Mix the glycerin and water so that it is one part glycerin and two parts water. You only need enough to submerge the leaves - about one cup.
- 2. Pour the solution into a flat pan, place the leaves in the solution, and then put the weight on the leaves to keep them submerged. (Tip: try using two Styrofoam or other disposable plates.) Put leaves and enough glycerin solution to just lightly cover the leaves in the bottom of one plate. Then put the other plate on top of the leaves and solution. Now you can put a weight of your choosing on the top plate without getting the weight in the solution.)
- 3. Keep the leaves submerged in the solution for 2-6 days.
- 4. Dry the leaves gently with a paper towel. They should feel soft and pliable.

As the mornings cooled and we moved our start of play inside, there were many opportunities for the children to turn their attention inwards to more reflective moments, enjoying simple craft activities that support a slowing down of the daily rhythm.

When the special day arrived for us to celebrate together with a most delicious Harvest Morning Tea, the children were so delighted to finally be eating the very tasty little butter cookies they had enjoyed preparing & baking together with Jo.

We all nourished our bodies and with the feast of food to share, including super juicy sweet corn, apple & cinnamon tea cake and plum jam on our warm

And at the end of a happy afternoon for us all, we were gifted the chance to come together for Storytime and listen to the sweet tale of "The Story Of The Apple Star". Which in its essence is a story about discovering the magic and beauty each of us hold inside, just waiting to be waiting to be nurtured, realised, illuminated, and ultimately shared for the greater good.

RECIPE: Rainbow Veg pizza



Ricotta base for pizza:

- 4 tbsp Flour
- 200g Ricotta
- 1 egg
- 4 tbsp oil
- Salt

Mix ricotta with the egg, oil and flour (depending on your flour, you may need between 3 and 6 tablespoons of flour, to reach the consistency of a regular pizza dough). Mix it in a bowl, then transfer onto a clean table surface and knead, adding t flour as needed till the dough no longer sticks to the hands.

Or use any pizza base of your choice.

Topping:

- Tomato sauce or quark (we used Shultz quark)
- Seasonal veggies that match the colour!

Some options

Red: tomatoes, red capsicums Orange: orange capsicums, carrots Yellow: yellow capsicums, corn

Green: capsicums, broccoli, spinach, peas, zucchini

Purple: red onion, beets

You can add cheese on top if you'd like, we went without it.





FAIRY WRENS UPDATE:

The more we are together, the happier we'll be! (Term 2)

Warm connections & friendships have blossomed within the group, as the children are forming their special Yandell community of learning. This unique kinder environment is a peaceful haven and hive of activity all at once, where this magical time spent together is all in a world of their very own.



These past few weeks of Term 2, our Fairy Wrens have been engaging more freely and confidently in small group play, which is typically a natural developmental flow on from more independent play. As the children begin to seek out these social interactions with each other, the emphasis is strong on just how much they do enjoy being together at Kinder.

The children have really grown in their abilities to share their imaginative ideas and welcome each other into their play, which occurs in a variety of ways. An invitation to join in may be communicated verbally if that is a child's strength, however it is more so observed by children offering welcoming





body language, kind expressions, along with actions (showing, doing) that demonstrate easily to other children how they can engage harmoniously.

As with any group of humans, amongst our littlest of learners there will also be those that prefer to observe group activity from a comfortable distance, taking in the dynamics and processing how they may go about approaching and involving themselves in



play scenarios, when and if this feels like the right choice for them. These interactions, whilst more passive in their approach, are equally as valuable in terms of a child's social development in the kinder setting.

And whilst we often see familiar groups gathering, there are always opportunities popping up to spend time with different friends and create new connections through a common joy or something excitingly appealing that grabs attention! Whether it









be a train ride to the shops with a very chatty driver that stops to let everyone on board (byo seat!) or digging a pathway for a flowing river and lake for planting a tree, with lots of busy hands and hardworking friends to help. Setting up a tunnel fence and filling it up with stones, sometimes you're the one holding things steady, sometimes you're the one dropping in the stones. Sometimes your're swinging and sometimes your're pushing.....
Whatever the day, whichever the role, there's a welcome place for everyone at kinder.
